Ska is faster and more upbeat, rocksteady has a slower tempo with more soulful melodies, and reggae features a distinctive offbeat rhythm and deeper lyrical content. Modern reggae has incorporated elements of dancehall, hip-hop, and electronic music, while maintaining its core themes of social consciousness and Rastafarian spirituality.
